

RECYCLABLES¹

- 1. Keep loose do not bag or tie
- 2. Flatten Kraft board/cardboard
- 3. Place into your kerbside recycling bin
 - Food or grease stained Kraft board/cardboard must be put into:
 - a. Home Compost Bin OR b. Council Waste Bin

Notes:

- 1. Source: Clean Up Australia, www.cleanup.org.au
- 2. Certified Commercially Compostable to Australian Standards AS4736 in industrial facilities where these exist. This means that the product <u>can only</u> break down in commercial/industrial composting facilities with controlled conditions where the perfect balance of heat, moisture, and oxygen is created to break-down organic and plant-based materials.
- 3. Certified Home Compostable to Australian Standard AS5810. This means that the product can be placed in a home compost bin where it will decompose naturally within a period of time. Every component and material used in the packaging will break down and decompose into the soil.
